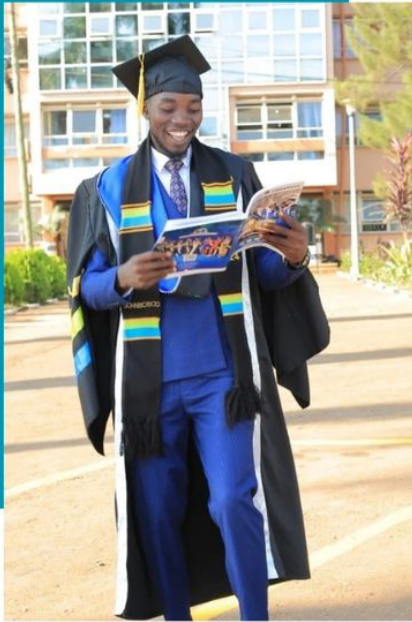

NEWSLETTER HIGHLIGHTS

- 500 youth graduated from New Hope Vocational training Institute with Certificates in different courses of study. The first of its kind event was graced by the Minister of Gender Labor & Social development, Hon Betty Amongi, BHTF Board members, partners and friends. Watch the graduation video [here](#)
- In partnership with the Rotaract Club of Kaihura, we implemented a **Rotary Global Grant** at New Hope Vocational training Institute. The highly anticipated kitchen, dining and latrine project is ready for handover.
- More than **50 boys and 4 trainers** now have accommodation at one of the two blocks of the new boy's Dorm.
- Both these projects will improve the living conditions and overall sanitation at the vocational school in Kyongera.





YOUTH EMPOWERMENT

- With support from BHTFUSA, the annual **Building men and Building Women** retreats engaged over **100 young men and women**. In addition to their vocational training, the students at New Hope Institute received mentorship and learnt life skills that are essential in shaping their livelihoods.

TAF MEN

- BHTFUSA hosted the second edition of the **TAF** (Teachable, Available, and Faithful) **Men Conference**. **60 men** were trained to embody the principles of openness to learning, willingness to serve, and commitment to positive change both in their professional and personal lives.

EDUCATION

- Our Back-to-school initiative reached over **1600** children in Kyenjojo, providing them with the necessary school supplies throughout the year (3 school terms).
- We are also excited to share that **17** of our supported students graduated from tertiary Institutions and universities.
- Furthermore, **18** children from Home Again sat their Primary Leaving Exams, **29** sat their Uganda Certificate of Education and **11** completed their Uganda Advanced Certificate of Education. These are in need of further support to continue their education.





FUTURE HOPE

- In informal education, our **Future Hope program** partnered with 10 local primary and secondary schools to equip learners with essential life skills, improve their learning outcomes and emphasize Christian values in their daily lives.

ORPHAN CARE

- Home Again Children's Home was blessed to receive **12 babies**, all under the age of five. **Four** of these have special needs. We cannot wait to see how God shows His goodness in their lives.

SOCIO-ECONOMIC STRENGTHENING

- We have witnessed the women groups we work with embrace the Village Savings and Loans Associations (VSLAs) concept to collectively afford school requirements for their children, and cater for other domestic needs.

HEALTH & MEDICAL CARE

Hope Again Medical Centre took their annual **medical outreach** to the people of Kafunda Village, Kyakisi Subcounty in Kyenjojo. Thanks to ThinSpace Africa, over **600 people** had the privilege of consulting and receiving care and treatment from highly skilled medical doctors. In addition to HIV/AIDS testing and counselling, antenatal care & family planning services, targeted groups received mosquito nets and reading glasses.

WATER, SANITATION & HYGIENE



With the support from BHTFUSA, **2 100 liter water tanks** were donated to Butiiti Modern Primary School, **5 new shallow wells** constructed and **2 boreholes repaired** within communities in Kyenjojo district.
